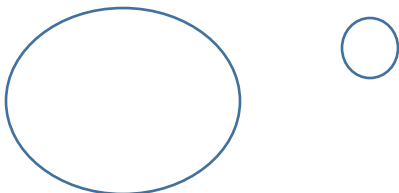

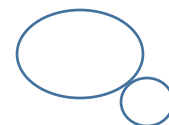

Tree Canada Greening Canada’s School Grounds Program - \$500-\$3500 – contributes making Canadian schools cleaner, greener places for children to learn and play

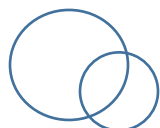

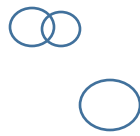
